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## EXTRA – CURRICULAR PROCEDURE (SECONDARY)

Student participation in extra-curricular activities should be seen as a privilege and not a right. Such events or activities serve to enrich school life and student experiences while at school but they are in addition to the students' core responsibility of working towards consolidating their learning and achieving their best. Student involvement in extra-curricular activities must not have a negative impact on their studies in their set subjects.

Eligibility Criteria: All students representing the school in any such events must understand that they deserve to represent their school and must demonstrate this understanding by:

1. Maintaining positive outcomes during the student tracking process (Weeks 3, 6, 9 Term 1, Weeks 4 & 8 Terms 2 & 3) and end of term reports.

Example:

Green = Passing (no concern), Amber = Passing or Borderline (concern with effort), Red = Not Passing (concern with effort and assessment)

Students (Year 8 – 11) who are 'tracked' as either red or amber in 2 or their subjects will be precluded from involvement in the extra-curricular activities. At Year 12, to be considered for inclusion in any extra-curricular activities it is expected that a student will be passing all subjects but consideration may be given if only 1 of their subjects is 'tracked' as an amber. Any Year 12 student 'tracked' as a red will preclude them from participation in extra-curricular activities.

2. Maintaining an attendance rate of 90% (DfE expectation is 95%) or above. (Illness/other circumstances will mean this criteria will be considered on a case-by-case basis).
3. Having no behaviour referrals or suspensions within a 10 week period, including buses.

If students are eligible and selected in an extra-curricular activity, they have a commitment to positively participate in all scheduled training/activities/aspects of the program to the best of their ability. They must also meet all communication and payment deadlines, whilst also ensuring that missed work in scheduled classes will be caught up/completed. If not satisfactorily adhered to, students may be precluded from other future extra-curricular activities.
